Sacramento Region Community Foundation transforms our community through focused leadership and advocacy that inspire partnerships and expand giving.

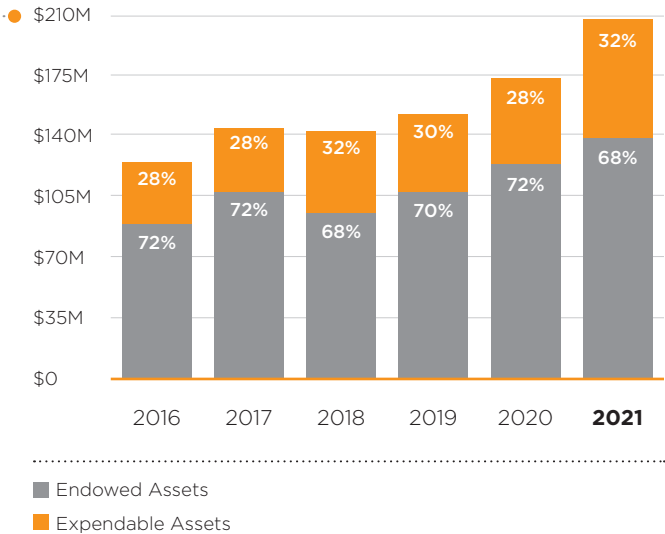
The Foundation was a leading grantmaker in the region in 2021, thanks to gifts and grants made by our generous fundholders.

This allowed the Foundation to make significant impact throughout the capital area—El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, and Yolo counties—by supporting the work of organizations and community partners who enrich our community every day.

\$206M

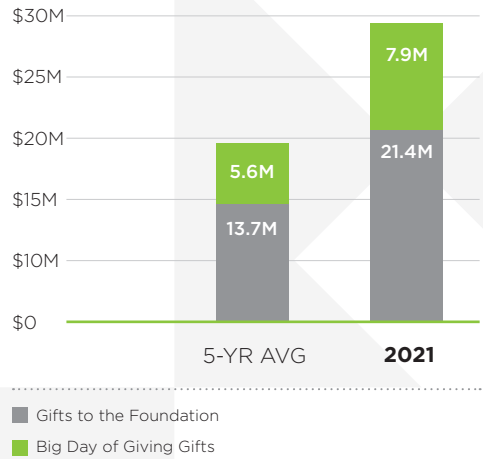
As of December 31, 2021, the Foundation's assets totaled \$206 million, reflecting activity such as generous gifts from donors, community partners, and investment income.



TOTAL GIFTS

\$29.3M

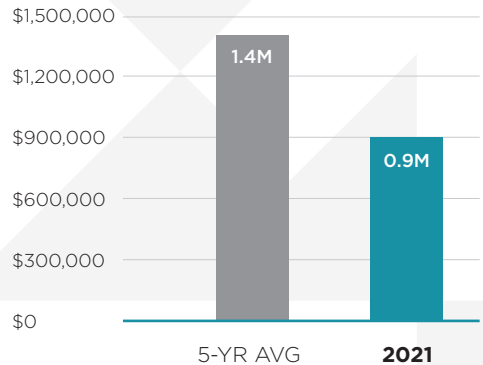
Through the contributions of our donors and partners, the Foundation received \$21.4 million in gifts last year. Additionally, the Foundation processed \$7.9 million through Big Day of Giving's online portal, more than half of the \$13.3 million generated by non-profits during the annual giving day.



SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

\$0.9M

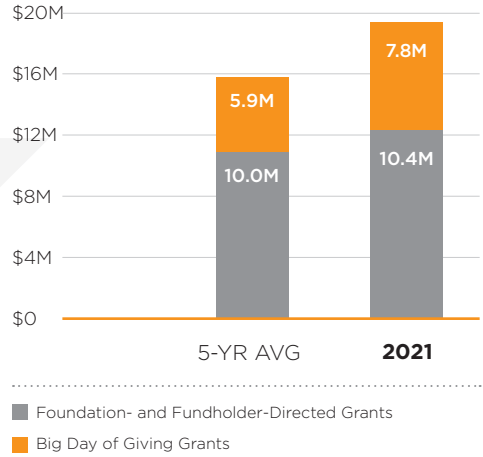
The Foundation awarded \$912,000 to support students working to achieve their dreams, which includes the scholarships awarded to Capital Area Promise Scholars. Fewer scholarships were distributed in 2021 than in years prior due to the fulfillment of a multi-year grant in 2020.



## TOTAL GRANTS

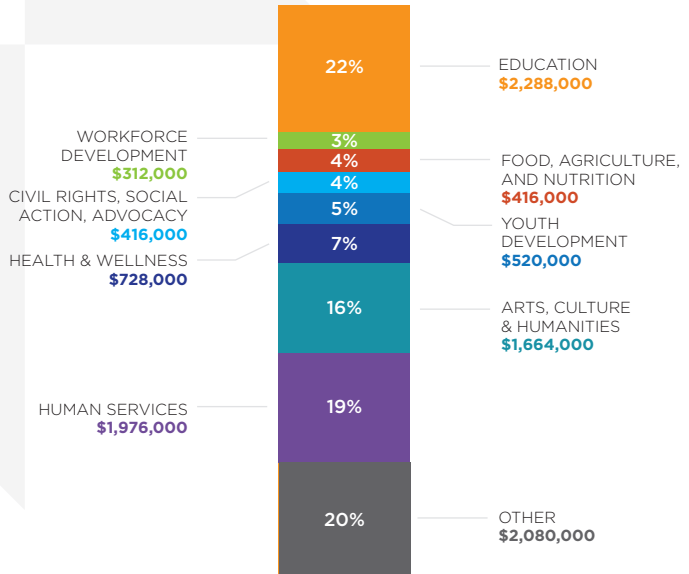
**\$18.2M**

Together with our fundholders and Big Day of Giving donors, the Foundation provided over 3,000 grants in 2021, totaling more than \$18.2 million—three-fourths of which were awarded to nonprofits serving our four-county region.



## GRANTS BY PROGRAM AREA

For over 35 years, our fundholders have supported organizations in the Sacramento region across a breadth of program areas. The mission categories of organizations supported by fundholder- and Foundation-directed grants in 2021 are reflected at right.



2021 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2021, thanks to the support of our fundholders, key stakeholders, and community partners, the Foundation:

**AWARDED**

over **\$18.2 million** in grants and scholarships in 2021.

**ESTABLISHED**

**38** new charitable funds.

**PROCESSED**

more than **68,000** gift and grant transactions.



**GRADUATED**

the third cohort of **22** nonprofit leaders through The Lab Capacity Building Program, a hub for innovation and problem-solving, bringing the total number of graduates since the program began in 2019 to **66**.

**INSPIRED**

**65,000** gifts to nonprofits during Big Day of Giving, raising **\$13.3 million** for 688 nonprofits. In all, Big Day of Giving has raised **\$65 million** for nonprofits since its inception in 2013.







**DISTRIBUTED** over **\$2.3 million** raised by the 32 golfer-philanthropists who participated in the 2021 Villara Capital Cup.

**ENGAGED** 22 young leaders throughout the Sacramento region in community service and philanthropy as part of our Grants Advisory Board for Youth.

**DEPLOYED** over \$300,000 from our Building Equitable Communities Fund to 40 organizations whose clients and services were significantly impacted by ongoing health and economic crises. Over 60% of the organizations funded serve or are led by people of color.



**RELEASED** the 2021 Sacramento Region Food System Action plan, a new study that identifies prevailing gaps in the Sacramento region's food system—and opportunities to close them.

**AWARDED** **403** scholarships to area students who have historically encountered significant barriers to college success, including students who received Capital Area Promise Scholars scholarship renewals.

**INVESTED** in standards-aligned virtual instruction to help **135,000** area students engage with arts during the pandemic.
