
The Foundation was a leading grantmaker in the region in 2022, thanks to gifts and grants made by our generous fundholders.

This allowed us to make significant impact throughout the capital area — El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, and Yolo counties — by supporting the work of organizations and community partners who enrich our community every day.

ASSETS

\$179.4M

As of December 31, 2022, the Foundation's assets totaled \$179.4 million, reflecting activity such as gifts from donors, community partners, and investment income.



TOTAL GIFTS

\$30.4M


Through the contributions of our donors and partners, the Foundation received \$30.4 million in gifts last year. Additionally, the Foundation processed \$7.1 million through Big Day of Giving's online portal, totaling more than half of the \$13.4 million generated by nonprofits during the annual giving day.


The Foundation awarded \$892,000 to support students working to achieve their dreams.



TOTAL GRANTS



Together with our fundholders and Big Day of Giving donors, the Foundation provided over 3,500 grants and scholarships in 2022, totaling nearly \$24.5 million. As in past years, three quarters of the grants were awarded in the four-county region. Included in the total is over \$5 million in grants that fulfill a partnership with Lodi Community Foundation and Community Foundation of San Joaquin.



GRANTS BY PROGRAM AREA

For 40 years, our fundholders have supported organizations in the Sacramento region across a breadth of program areas. The mission categories of organizations supported by fundholder- and Foundation-directed grants in 2022 are reflected at right, exclusive of the grants processed in partnership with Lodi Community Foundation and Community Foundation of San Joaquin, mentioned above.



2022 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2022, thanks to the support of our fundholders, key stakeholders, and community partners, the Foundation:

AWARDED

nearly \$24.5 million in grants and scholarships.

ESTABLISHED

33 charitable funds to support donors' philanthropy.

PROCESSED

more than 62,000 gift and grant transactions.



INSPIRED

more than 54,000 gifts to 718 nonprofits during the tenth Big Day of Giving, raising \$13.4 million. In all, Big Day of Giving has raised \$78 million for nonprofits since its inception in 2013.



GRADUATED

the fourth cohort of 22 nonprofit leaders through The Lab Capacity Building Program, a hub for problem-solving and innovation, bringing the total number of graduates since the program began in 2019 to 88.



AWARDED

376 scholarships to students pursuing their educational dreams.



ENGAGED

young leaders in philanthropy through our Grants Advisory Board for Youth. They distributed grants to five youth-led projects, supporting efforts to promote food access, increase wellbeing through arts, and more.

PARTNERED

with Listos California, a program of the California Office of Emergency Services, and six local nonprofit organizations to build disaster resilience and spread awareness among the most at-risk communities in the region.



PROVIDED

the Gloria Burt Sacramento Region Arts Fellowship to five local artists in partnership with the Sacramento Alliance for Regional Arts (SARA) and Blue Line Arts.
